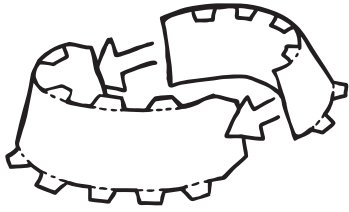

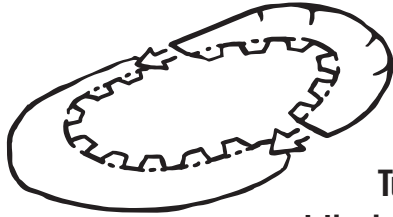

on colored cardstock or
color the pieces with
markers or pencils.

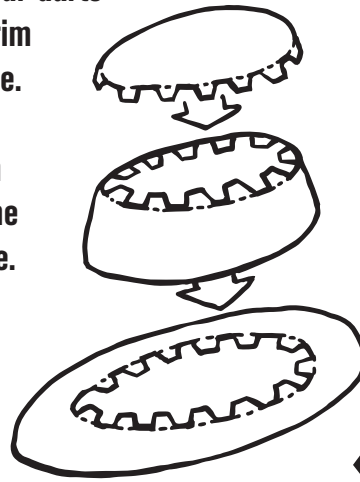


Cut out the pieces and fold the
tabs on the dotted lines.

Tuck in the four darts
at the back of the brim
and secure with tape or glue.

Align the two pieces of the brim
together and the two sides of the
hat and secure with glue or tape.

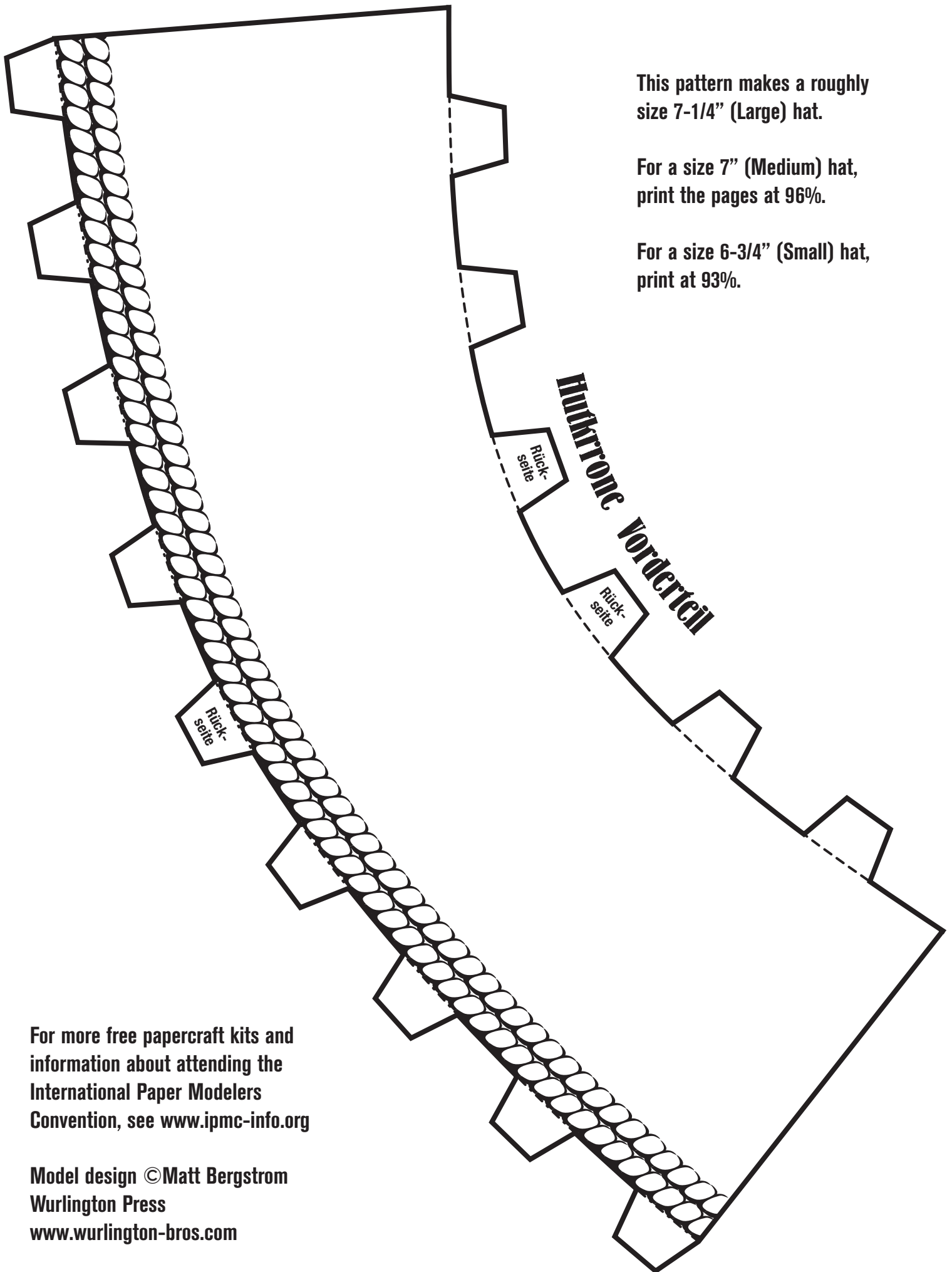
Interlock the tabs on the hat
brim to the sides first and
glue or tape in place, then
add the top of the hat.

This pattern makes a roughly size 7-1/4" (Large) hat.

For a size 7" (Medium) hat, print the pages at 96%.

For a size 6-3/4" (Small) hat, print at 93%.

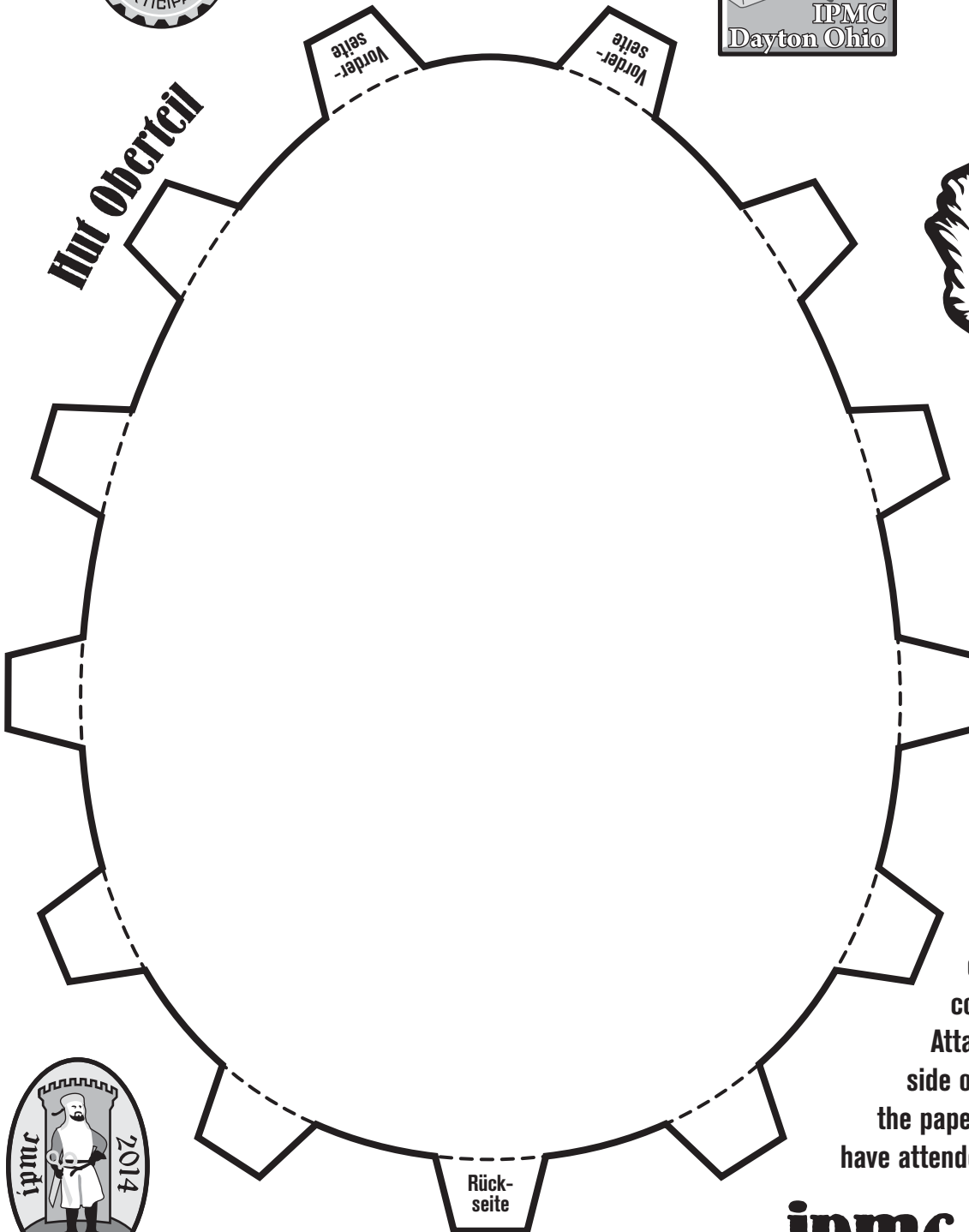
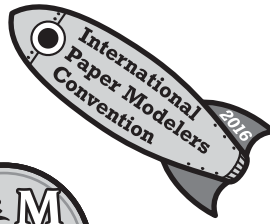
